To All Individuals, Partnerships, Trusts and Corporations: Mass General Laws Chapter 59 Section 29 requires that the Board of Assessors give notice to all persons subject to taxation in their respective town regarding personal property. Businesses must file State Tax Form 2. If you own a second home located in Chester, the furniture and fixtures are taxable, and owners must file State Tax Form 2HF annually, unless it's a rental property. Applications are available on-line at <u>www.mass.gov</u>, or at the Assessors Office Monday – Wednesday, 9:00 am – 1:00 pm. These lists must be filed on or before March 1st of each year. Failure to submit this list may remove certain rights of appeal for the taxpayer.

#### From the Desk of the Town Clerk

The forms for the Annual Street Listing were mailed in January. If you have moved into town in the last year, and/or your household has not received a form, please contact the Town Clerk's office for one. We want all households to be counted in the town's population, as this can translate into extra funding for our town. Thank you to all the citizens who have already returned their forms. If you haven't yet, take a moment now to complete it and return it. Second mailings add an additional unnecessary expense to the town budget, and everyone's cooperation is needed to avoid unnecessary expenditures of taxpayer dollars.

Dog license applications are now being accepted. The tags will arrive during the week of February 16. Tags will be mailed to those who submit applications before then. Fees have been decreased this year and are free to those age 70 or older; you can also order the license online. Take a moment to do it now while it's on your mind. We are striving to make this as easy as possible for all. Nomination papers are now available in the Town Clerk's office for those who want to run for public office in town this year. The May 6 ballot will include one candidate for each of the following offices: Selectman, Board of Health, Board of Assessors, Electric Light Commission, Town Clerk, School Committee, and two Library Trustees. All are for three year terms, except for the Town Clerk, which is a one year term. If you are interested, yet, have questions, please arrange to meet informally with the Town Clerk, Sue Kucharski. She can guide you with what you need to know before deciding to throw your hat in the ring.
