The Annual Town Election will be held on Saturday, May 5 from 9am -5pm. The ballot is now set. All candidates running for office have been invited to a "Meet the Candidates" event which will be held on Saturday, April 28, from 1-2:30 pm in the town hall auditorium. This will be your chance as a voter to meet the candidates, ask them questions, and become an informed voter.

The ballot for the town's Annual Election on Saturday, May 5 is now set. The following citizens have stepped forward to run for the following town offices for three-year terms. All candidates for these terms are unopposed on the ballot, though other citizens may choose to run a write-in campaign.

Anyone interested in mounting a write-in campaign for any of the above offices should contact the Town Clerk for more information.

The last day to register to vote in this election is Friday April 13. The Town Clerk's office will be open from 2-8 pm for those who need to register to vote, or conduct any other business.

The last day to request an Absentee Ballot for this election is Friday, May 4 at 12 pm. Absentee Ballots will be available starting on April 13.

Dog Licenses expired March 31. A grace period for new licenses will be given until April 15. After that a \$10 fine will be collected in addition to the license fee. The fine rises to \$50 on June 1. You can order your dog's license online, or by mail (postal or black mailbox outside town hall) if we have a current rabies vaccination on file. You can get a license in person during office hours, every Monday, from 6-8 pm (except the April 16 holiday), and any Wednesday from 10:30 am - 3:30 pm. The office will be closed on Wednesday, April 11, but be open on Friday, April 13 from 2-8 pm
