Chester Historical Society

Museum Update: Society President John Hultman reports construction figures are still being collected for our grant applications. We had approximately 25 people visit us during Chester on Track. We will be open on Sundays from 10 - 2 for July and August, and upon request.

Historical Society members met with Chester Elementary students for their annual visit to the Old Jail and their first of what we hope the beginning of many visits to the Museum.

May has also been a busy month planning with the Chester Firemen's Association for the Memorial Day services May 28. It is hoped we will have a large gathering to honor and show our appreciation and respect for all veterans past and present.

Bits and pieces: 1850 "THE EVOLUTION OF VETERANS BRIDGE" At a meeting of the inhabitants of Chester qualified to vote in Town affairs held on the 11th day of November, 1850 the following votes were passed. Chose Otis Taylor Clerk Pro tem, Article 1 Chose F. Kyle Esq. Moderator, Article 2 Chose David Cannon, Wm. Sheppard and E.G. Howe a committee to superintend the rebuilding of the Bridge at Chester Factories this coming season. Voted This committee be authorized to build such a bridge at C. Factories as they shall judge best for the Interest of the Town, but NOT to put a roof over the same. 1895 Contract was made with George W. Smith of Westfield, to build the abutments and piers for both the Main and Maple Street Bridges, according to specifications furnished by the engineers for \$ 3,745.00. Contract was made with R.F. Hawkins of Springfield, to build a two-span bridge at Main Street and remove the old Main street bridges to Maple street, according to plans and call for proposals for \$ 6,300. 1971 OUR NEW BRIDGE----Construction began in 1970 and was completed in 1971. The contractor was Puffer Construction Co., Sunderland, Mass. Total cost of bridge was \$217,460.00 The town's share of the cost was \$10,980.00. At the dedication ceremonies held on May 31, 1971 the bridge was named VETERANS BRIDGE."
