Chester Historical Society meeting will be held Saturday, Sept. 8 at the Chester History Museum at 9 am and as all monthly meetings are open to the public anyone is welcome to attend. BITS AND PIECES - Does anyone have information on what happened to the Veteran's Memorial that was placed on the High School lawn during or right after World War 11? Marguerite Tracey a long time resident organized and supervised the funding and building of this U.S.O. Memorial during World War 11. It is remembered that near Memorial Day each year the children from Chester Elementary would cross the street to stand in front of the Memorial and hold services to honor those who served. This is a treasure we would like to have for our Museum and if anyone has any information please contact a member of the Society. Marguerite also had much information on the first hand-cranked telephone and worked over 50 years in the telephone service including the office located in the former Bevan's Drug Store in Chester. (A picture of this office was printed in one of our Historical Calendars). Berkshire Eagle- July 28, 1956- New Chester Bank Open House – Chester Cooperative Bank will hold open house at its new quarters on Main Street tomorrow from 3 to 9 pm. The bank was incorporated Dec. 21 1923 and has been located in rear of Bevan's Drug Store since then. The new one-story building on Main Street was financed by a group of citizens organized as the Chester Development and Improvement Co. It is being leased to the bank with plans for eventual purchase to the institution. Architect Ralph Sizer of Westfield designed the new building. The contractors were Smith and Fisk of Middlefield. On hand for the Open House will be President Samuel J. Donnelly, Vice President Charles F. Pease, Treasurer Lester W. Simmons, Clerk Willard A. Pease and the following Directors: Richard Bevan, Stuart Eames, Harry C. Haskins, Dr. John Huffmire, George W. Olds, Thomas Rose, Seigle Shafer and William H. Stevens. Frank Fay was the first president of the 33 year old bank. The bank's FIRST annual report showed assets at \$ 17,841.42 with 1,258 shares and 163 accounts in force. This month's report showed assets at \$ 496,776 with 2,861 shares and 415 accounts in force. Records show the first loan was made to Burt H. Rix, one of the charter members of the corporation. We continue to ask for pictures of those who have or are now serving our country. We will make copies and return all originals. These are used in our annual calendar and also for our Museum binders on servicemen and women.

- **by mail** Mail-in forms are available at the Town Hall, the Chester Post Office, and the library
- **Online** visit www.sec.state.ma.us and click on the button for Elections and Voting.
