The Town Clerk will be available at the Chester Town Hall for early in person voting at the following times: Saturday October 17th from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM Sunday October 18th from 12:00 PM to 3:00 PM Monday October 19th from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM Tuesday October 20th from 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM Wednesday October 21st from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM Thursday October 22nd from 10:00 AM to 1:00PM Friday October 23rd from 3:00 PM- 5:00 PM Saturday October 24th from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM Sunday October 25th from 12:00 PM to 3:00 PM Monday October 26th from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM Tuesday October 27th from 2:00 PM to 4:00PM Wednesday October 28th from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM Thursday October 29th from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM Friday October 30th from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM The polls will be open on November 3^{rd} from 7 AM – 8 PM. If you choose to vote by mail please make sure you return your ballot in enough time to be counted. Postmarked November 3 and received Nov 5. The big black drop box is secure or you can turn your ballot in on any day of early voting. The last day to request a mail in ballot is October 28 and the last day to register to vote is October 24. Please take this time to check that you are an active registered voter. November 3rd is too late. October 25 is too late. If you voted early you can track your ballot online. No matter how you vote you can vote only once. Remember to wear a mask and bring your own pen if you wish. Social distancing will be enforced. Also no buttons, hats, stickers with candidates' names are allowed on your person or in plain sight. You must be 150 from the town hall entrance to have such items in sight.

Past due and shut off notices are based on the number of days of non-payment, not account balance.
