CHSAA Newsletter and Reunion Invitation Released

The Chester High School Alumni Association's annual newsletter and reunion invitation has been mailed and is available on the Association Website (http://chesterhigh.wordpress.com). This year's reunion is scheduled for Saturday, August 28, 2021, at the Chester Train Station. The deadline for reservations is August 20, 2021.

The reunion draws a large group of people associated with the former Chester High School, including Chester Residents who graduated from Gateway after Chester High School closed in the late 1960s. This year's festivities begin with a social hour at 1:00 p.m. at the Chester Railroad Depot and continue informally throughout the entire weekend as "Blue Devils" and "Quarriers" wander around town visiting old friends and relatives. The Association's annual business meeting will be held at 4:30 p.m., and Officers and Board Members will meet at 12:00 p.m.

The newsletter includes information regarding by-law changes that will clarify membership eligibility and eliminate annual dues. Boomsma also explains, "Elections may seem a bit confusing... since last year's meeting was not held due to COVID. We always need people to help keep the Association and Reunions happening. Tree and Brush Removal

Chester Municipal Light Department recognizes and appreciates that trees and some brush are valuable assets to our landscape and to the quality of our life in our area. However, this must be balanced with the constant threat to the reliability of the ratepayer's electric service, line worker's and public safety, and the health of Chester's roadside trees. To do that we must keep trees and brush that are located near power lines pruned and trimmed on a regular basis and in some cases removal of the tree and drastic mowing of brush. It must be noted that trees and tree branches are the most frequent causes of service outages and interruptions to our electric distribution system. Many outages are caused by tree limbs which fall into power lines causing damage to wires, short circuits and other problems. Trees adjacent to CMELD's rights-of way must be kept pruned and clear of the power lines according to this policy. This helps us provide a safe and reliable supply of electricity to our ratepayers. Here at Chester Municipal Electric Light Department we strive to bring our customers reliable electrical service. Therefore, we would like to notify you that Chester Municipal Electric Light Department will be trimming branches and mowing brush in the near future.

Call Before You Dig!

If you are planning an outdoor project that includes digging, remember that there may be buried utility lines that you need to avoid. Water, sewer, telephone, and cable television may be located underground, in addition to electric lines. Damaging or disturbing the underground utilities could cause power outages or interruptions of other utility services. Even worse, you could be seriously hurt. Chester Historical Society

Thanks to all who visited the Old Chester Jail and the Chester History Museum during the Chester Becket Railroad Historical Tour.

The Old Chester Jail is owned by the Town of Chester, and is maintained by Chester Historical Commission, through the yearly appropriation. The Chester History Museum, across the street from the Jail, is owned by the Chester History Society, and is funded solely through donations and fundraisers. No taxpayer money is spent on the museum.

The Historical Society recently received a large donation, and is using the money to continue the restoration of the museum. Work has started on the second floor, and the first priority is to create a year round conditioned room to store the sensitive artifacts.

The Society / Commission meets in the museum in the Summer and in the jail in the Winter.

The museum and jail will be open Sundays from 10 - 2 from August 1st through September 5th, and on August 28th from 10 - 2 for the Chester High Annual Reunion.
