Payments received during the last week of the month may not be reflected on your new bill. Payments must be received on or before the discount due date in order to be eligible for the discount. For our customer's convenience, CMELD is always willing to discuss budget or payment plans and payments can be dropped 24/7 in the black lock box on the Town Hall steps. Past due and shut off notices are based on the number of days of non-payment, not account balance.
