John Baldasaro said anticipating increase in legal use due to possible changes in town. Jason also asked why not prop 2 ½? Andy Myers said 4.6% was within the tax levy limit without prop2 ½.

ARTICLE 7: VOCATIONAL TUITION AND TRANSPORTATION

(Last year's figure - \$209,307).

Majority vote required John Baldasaro accepted the article as read, Ann Daley seconded. Discussion, was asked how much will be in the stabilization account? \$700,000.00 is the answer. 0- No Votes All in Favor 83 Registered Voters present Article approved

ARTICLE 16: HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TRAINING FUND

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from available funds, **\$10,000** to establish the Highway Department Training Fund, or take any other action relative thereto.

Majority vote required John Baldasaro accepted the article as read, Andy Sutton seconded. Jason Forgue asked why not make this a line item? John responded this is new this year and hopefully we won't have to use it every year and the employees will stay on longer.

ARTICLE 17:

CORNERSTONE CHURCH

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept as a gift for general municipal purposes the so-called Cornerstone Church property located at 1 Middlefield Road,

Chester; and further to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from available funds, \$50,000 to renovate the property for public use, and \$20,000 to cover annual expenses of utilities, heating fuel, insurance and routine maintenance; and further to authorize the Board of Selectmen to take any other action deemed appropriate in relation to such acquisition; or take any other action relative thereto.

Two Thirds vote required John Baldasaro accepted the article as read, Rich Holzman seconded. Discussion followed. John Baldasaro stated he would vote no on this article. Stating we are not in the real estate business. Veronica Marr asked about the septic, Andy Myers said he would consider allowing the building to still be connected to his septic. Joe Hepworth asked if we could sell the building after getting it? Answer is Yes we can. Keirsen Broman made a presentation on how the building could be used, COA in basement, Police could expand into COA room at town hall. Upstairs could be used for meetings, Theater practice, library function, etc. Michell Kinney spoke to how well maintained the building was, Rich Holzman spoke to the possibilities for the building before deciding. Barbara Huntoon asked to table the question to get more information. Rich Holzman made a motion to table the article, Annette LaMountain seconded.
