## DRIVEWAY PERMIT STANDARDS

- 1. Definition of <u>driveway</u>: A portion of a lot which is prepared for vehicular traffic and which provides access from a street to or towards a structure on a lot.
- 2. No driveway may be constructed so as to connect with a Town or County Road, or a street in an approved subdivision, unless a driveway permit has been issued.
- 3. No building permit for a use which will involve the construction of a driveway which connects with a Town or County road, or a street in an approved subdivision shall be issued unless a driveway permit has been issued.
- 4. Permit standards apply only to the portions of a driveway which lie within the street right of way (normally 25 feet to each side of the street center line) and within 50 feet of the street right of way, measured along the driveway center line.
- 5. Driveways shall be connected to the street in such a way as to provide safe vehicular entry to and exit from the street, and so as not to create any hazards for other vehicles using the street, or for pedestrians.
- 6. Driveways shall be connected to the street in such a way as not to create danger of overloading or impeding the operation of street drainage facilities, and so as not to create a danger of flooding or erosion on other lots.
- 7. Driveways shall not intersect the street at an angle of less than 70 degrees, or have a slope of greater than 5% within the street right of way, or more than 10% within 50 feet of the street right of way, measured on the driveway center line. These provisions may be waived by vote of the Selectboard if in its opinion the proposed driveway will meet the standards set forth in #5 and #6 above.
- 8. Driveway permits may require that the owner or applicant install, at their own expense, such facilities as are deemed needed to ensure that the above standards are met. This may include culverts, ditches, embankments, paving, blacktopping, and warning signs inside or outside the street right of way.
  - A. Minimum culvert size: Diameter to be determined by the Highway Superintendent, 20' length, head walls at both ends.
  - B. End of driveway meeting paved way, must be paved for at least a distance of 12' x width of driveway, by owner.
- 9. In applying for driveway permit, applicant shall supply a plot plan showing the point on the lot frontage where it is proposed that the driveway intersects with the street, and the location of the driveway within 50 feet of the street right of way.
- 10. The Selectboard may authorize the Highway Superintendent, or any other person, to issue driveway permits.
